


1. File with maps, contact details of local representative provided to each team
2. 30mins to 2 hours to reach the village
3. Meet the representative and vaccinate dogs at static point
4. Local representative will take the teams around the wards
5. Enter data in the WVS app
6. Cover the area on foot & vehicle
7. Assembly point GPS at each village shared with each team member
8. Lunch in the field – TL to pay the bill if not provided by local body
9. Daily Target: vaccinate 70-100 animals a day




DINDIGUL DISTRICT - KODAIKANAL UNION



A Free Mass Anti-Rabies Vaccination Campaign :

Kodaikanal: On 4th May 2025, the Kodaikanal Society for Protection and Care for Animals (KSPCA), in collaboration with Mission Rabies India, launched the "RABIESFREE KODAIHILLS" Free Mass Anti-Rabies Vaccination Camp across the scenic hills of Kodaikanal. The event was inaugurated by Dr. J. Radhakrishnan, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Chairman & Managing Director of TANGEDCO, and Principal Secretary for the Civil Supplies Department, Govt of TN.

Dr. Radhakrishnan personally administered the first vaccination, formally launching this critical public health drive.

Dr. J Radhakrishnan commended KSPCA's and Mission Rabies efforts, emphasizing the importance of extending such successful programs to areas like Greater Chennai Corporation to reduce dog bite incidents and save lives.

Mass anti-rabies drive launched in Kodaikanal



The Kodaikanal Society for Protection and Care for Animals (KSPCA), in collaboration with Mission Rabies India, launched a large-scale free anti-rabies vaccination campaign titled 'RABIES FREE KODAI HILLS' across the hill region from May 5 to 10. The campaign was inaugurated by J Radhakrishnan, additional chief secretary and principal secretary for the civil supplies department, who administered the first dose. Using a dedicated mobile tracking app developed by World Veterinary Service (WVS), the campaign ensures accountability and effective monitoring of vaccinated animals. More than 5,000 dogs are expected to be covered. With no human rabies cases reported since 2016, Kodaikanal is close to being declared a rabies-controlled zone. Radhakrishnan highlighted the need to expand similar models to other regions.




