Animal Birth Control/Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ABC/ARV) Project

Kodaikanal, one of the oldest hill station and now a wildlife sanctuary, is facing a serious ecological issue. With illegal buildings, encroachments, traffic, bad roads, pollution and the worst being the poor waste management in town. It is a terrible sight to see not only dogs feeding on overflowing garbage but also domestic cattle, horses, ponies, monkeys and even bison. When wild animals have easy access to food, why would they go back into the forest to fend for themselves, and even if they do need to, most of their grazing areas are encroached. This ultimately comes down to the poor waste management. It leads to the multiplication of dogs, which affects wildlife as well as the environment. Moreover, deadly diseases like Leptospirosis, tetanus, rabies, etc. are spreading. When stray dogs or semi-owned dogs multiply, so does the threat of rabies which can infect and be transmitted by a wide range of mammals, but dogs remain the main reservoir.

Like many Indian cities, Kodaikanal has a growing population of street dogs. However Kodai is not a typical city. The natural beauty and temperate climate continue to attract new residents, seasonal residents, and short-term tourists, both domestic and foreign. This rapid population growth has put pressure on municipal infrastructure, affecting traffic and sanitary facilities, including the management of food waste. The overabundance of street dogs has resulted in an increasingly competitive environment for these animals, which in turn leads to abandoned puppies, underfed adult dogs, conflict between dogs, and sometimes aggression towards humans, which may result because of a threat of rabies. Addressing dog overpopulation in a humane solution and adopting the goal of hundred per cent rabies vaccination coverage, hand in hand with a plan for managing garbage and reducing street litter, will result in a safer, healthier environment for all Kodai citizens and the tourists who visit Kodaikanal. KSPCA (Kodaikanal Society for Protection and Care for Animals), along with the municipality and in collaboration with Humane Society International India (HSI) has implemented the ABC (animal birth control) /ARV (anti rabies vaccination) program as well as conducting free equine medical camps, educational awareness programs on waste management and the need for ABC/ARV in Kodaikanal. KSPCA is fighting hard to make Kodaikanal a model town to its many visitors showing a caring, well-managed community and a rabies free township.

On 15th May 2017 a project to sterilize and rabies vaccinate dogs was launched in a collaboration of KSPCA, the Kodaikanal Municipality and the Humane Society International India. This project was scheduled to carry on until 15 July and ended up finishing on 8th of



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July 2017 as there was need to do an anti rabies vaccination drive outskirts of Kodaikanal municipal limits. From 15th of MAY 2017 until 8th of July 2017 total of 501 dogs were sterilized and vaccinated. HSI India and KSPCA are both Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI) recognized and member of FIAPPO (Federation Indian Animal Protection Organizations).

As per the G.O, the Kodaikanal municipality ensures reimbursement of Rs700/ dog, out of which they would pay us RS.350/ dog and the balance RS.350 KSPCA will have to get reimbursed from AWBI.

Kodaikanal municipalities have reimbursed RS.350* 501 dogs so far and KSPCA will have to get the reimbursement from AWBI still.

KSPCA, under a MOU with HSI India, have paid HSI India RS 1000/ Dog. So far 501 dogs have been sterilized and vaccinated. Thanks to our donors we have managed to pay RS.5,01,000 (for 501dogs * Rs 1000). We have had other expenses such as accommodation, Transportation, repair and upgrade of ABC facility, gathering of materials for the ABC facility, promotion advertisements and announcements for the ABC/ARV project which is all accounted for and would be produced at anytime, if required.

The goals of this project are as follows:

- 1) To reduce the number of street dogs in Kodaikanal. A controlled, healthy number of street dogs in Kodai will improve the welfare of the dogs and increase the safety of citizens and visitors. For Kodaikanal, tourism is an important source of income, and so to improve the safety and beauty of the town will be of benefit, and will send out a good message to all those who visit. KSPCA wants Kodaikanal to be a model of humane responsible care of dogs and a safe environment for all.
- 2) To have a rabies free town. Incidences of rabies have been observed in the last six months. Culling of dogs is not the solution as it is not humane and will only result in the problem recurring again before not too long. 100 per cent rabies vaccinations of dogs is the best and only way to make Kodaikanal a rabies free zone. Every dog who comes in for sterilization also receives a rabies vaccination, and the final phase of KSPCA-HSI's work here will be free rabies vaccination camps in different parts of the town. On an ongoing basis KSPCA plans to do regular free rabies camps to ensure that Kodaikanal moves steadily towards being a safe and rabies free town. The camps done before was in 2 drives in December 2016, one during January 2017,



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another during March 2017 and several from 9th July 2017 to 15 July 2017 and many more to come.

- 3) Free sterilizations/rabies vaccinations for owned/semi-owned/free roaming dogs.
KSPCA is encouraging country dog owners in Kodaikanal to voluntarily bring in their dogs for sterilization. The benefits of having a sterilized dog are clear: a) no unwanted puppies; b) male dogs are less aggressive; c) female dogs are healthier if they do not have repeated pregnancies; d) female dogs do not go into heat and attract aggressive males to your home; e) a reduced number of dogs also reduces competition amongst dogs which makes for less fighting and aggression generally.
- 4) Our future plan: To make Kodaikanal a Rabies free town and prevent other zoonotic diseases to spread by conducting regular medical camps for all animals, help in waste management with concerned departments and work along with other Ngos to make a clean green Kodaikanal. Help in fighting all cruelty cases to our best efforts possible. Educational awareness and many more events to show people the need for compassion towards Animals and Environment. Work along with Forest Department and Kodaikanal Municipality to set up an infirmary or a 24 hour emergency facility with a Veterinary Doctor available full time for both domestic and wildlife.
- 5) We are hoping that the team of HSI INDIA will come back and re-start the ABC/ARV program every few months to ensure the controlled population, healthy and vaccinated dogs in Kodaikanal municipal limits and also as per our District Collector's wish to initiate the ABC/ARV program in village and other areas outside Kodaikanal municipal limits. It is indeed an honor to work with such a dedicated and professional team like HSI India.

KSPCA and Kodaikanal Municipality feel that this project has launched a new era in humane, responsible care of Kodaikanal dogs and maybe other animals too. All possible public education and support of this project is necessary in order to make it a success and to be able to carry on this good work on an ongoing basis. We hope that every citizen of Kodaikanal and around Dindigul district can be informed about this project and will then cooperate in every possible way to HELP MAKE KODAIKANAL A MODEL TOWN: RABIES FREE, SAFE FROM DOG AGGRESSION AND OVERPOPULATION, AND HUMANE IN ITS TREATMENT OF DOGS!

About the program :

Catching:

3-4 staff from team HSI India along with a volunteer from KSPCA who is fluent with the local language starts the day by 6:30- 7 am to go catching dogs ward by ward in the Kodaikanal municipality area. There are 24 wards in the Kodaikanal municipality and catching in this terrain has been quite a challenge. But most of the dogs are free roaming, semi-owned colony dogs. The method of hand catching was used in the case of extremely friendly dogs and sometimes the colony care takers handed over the dog themselves. Some dogs which were friendly yet reluctant to let us close were caught by butterfly nets. Trap cages were also used in the case of aggressive dogs and the ones that were very difficult to catch in the hilly and forested terrains of Kodaikanal. There were days when 14-15 dogs were caught and days when only 8-10 would be caught. Some female dogs were not caught as either they were lactating or pregnant.

Initially team HSI India found it difficult to catch dogs as people objected thinking they were there to cull the dogs. There was a huge communication problem even with a communicator who knew a little Tamil from Team HSI India who tried convincing people why the team is there and what their goal is. Some agreed on letting them inside the streets to catch dogs and even helped them where to locate them and some just denied allowing them and ended up fighting. It is only after this that a Tamil speaking local volunteer from KSPCA who knew the areas and people assisted them with catching and release and communication.



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Team HSI India used an app for catching and release. Picture of the dog, the tag number for the day Eg:AA-1, AA-2 if it's from the same area OR AB-1 when caught from a different area, colour of the dog, breed if any, method of catching, whether owned-semi-owned or street, male or female, and the geo-location from where the dog was caught is logged in the app to ensure the release is also done in a safe manner by using the app during the day of release of the dogs. Also driver record sheet for the day and the catching sheet were maintained along with owner consent form just in case there were dogs that were owned roaming freely on streets. In fact many dogs that were roaming freely on streets were owned or semi-owned hence many came forward to take responsibility to sign the owner consent forms. A tag collar is also put around the neck of the dog the day of catching, and removed the day the dog is released in its area. The catching vehicle has a person sitting inside the van to make sure the dogs are not at each other and clean up if they vomit or pass motion when vehicle is moving. Once the dogs reach the facility and moved into the pre-op room, the vehicle is cleaned for the release of dogs late afternoon. Equipments /materials used:

- Mobile GPS app to log information of the dog caught and when releasing
- Butterfly nets
- Biscuits
- Towels while letting one dog in and covering the other dog in the vehicle
- Driver record sheet
- Catching record sheet
- Awareness Fliers about abc/ arv program
- First aid medicines
- Owner consent forms- (if owned and free roaming, colony dogs, semi-owned etc)

There are three rooms for dogs – 2 post –op room and 1 anaesthesia/ pre-op room and a room on top floor for cooking, stock room-for keeping medicines, auto clave, fridge, washroom and accommodation for veterinarian and Para-veterinary staff.

The facility has 24 hours water and electrical supply. Rooms have adequate light and proper ventilation and a drain out for water to go out when cleaning the rooms. Portable kennels were placed in the rooms for two- door safety and could accommodate maximum of 20 dogs in each room.

Every morning and evening kennels were cleaned scrubbed, food bowls and mats were cleaned and room kept dry after release and before moving dogs into the room.

The catching vehicle was cleaned before catching and after release. All equipments cleaned sterilized and surgical drapes washed everyday to ensure complete hygiene and safety.

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Pre -op room- Procedure-surgery and recovery-

Weight and body condition or body parameters like temperature, orifices, eye mucosa, any wound or fracture is checked and after 12 hr fasting ,First xylazine and atropine is given, After 10 mins ketamine im Ivermectin s/c Belamyl im Penicillin im Melonex im is given. The Para-vet shaves and cleans and keeps the dog ready, during preparation dizapam is given through intravenous and the animal is taken into the OT van of HSI for surgery .It takes 10 to 12 minutes for a male and for a female it takes about 15-17 minutes .The day of surgery itself Anti-Rabies Vaccination is given for the dog and cephatoxime (short acting antibiotic is given) in the OT van.

The type of surgery done for female dogs is mid-line method and in male its median – Raphae.

Recovery time-

The dogs are taken into the post op room and placed on clean rubber mats, and it take 1-2 hours for the dog to recover from complete anaesthesia, during that period one Para-vet is always present to check pulse rate and respiratory rate.

At night, food and water is placed in the post op rooms, and also in the morning and the dogs are kept in post op kennel until complete recovery or 2 days until release.

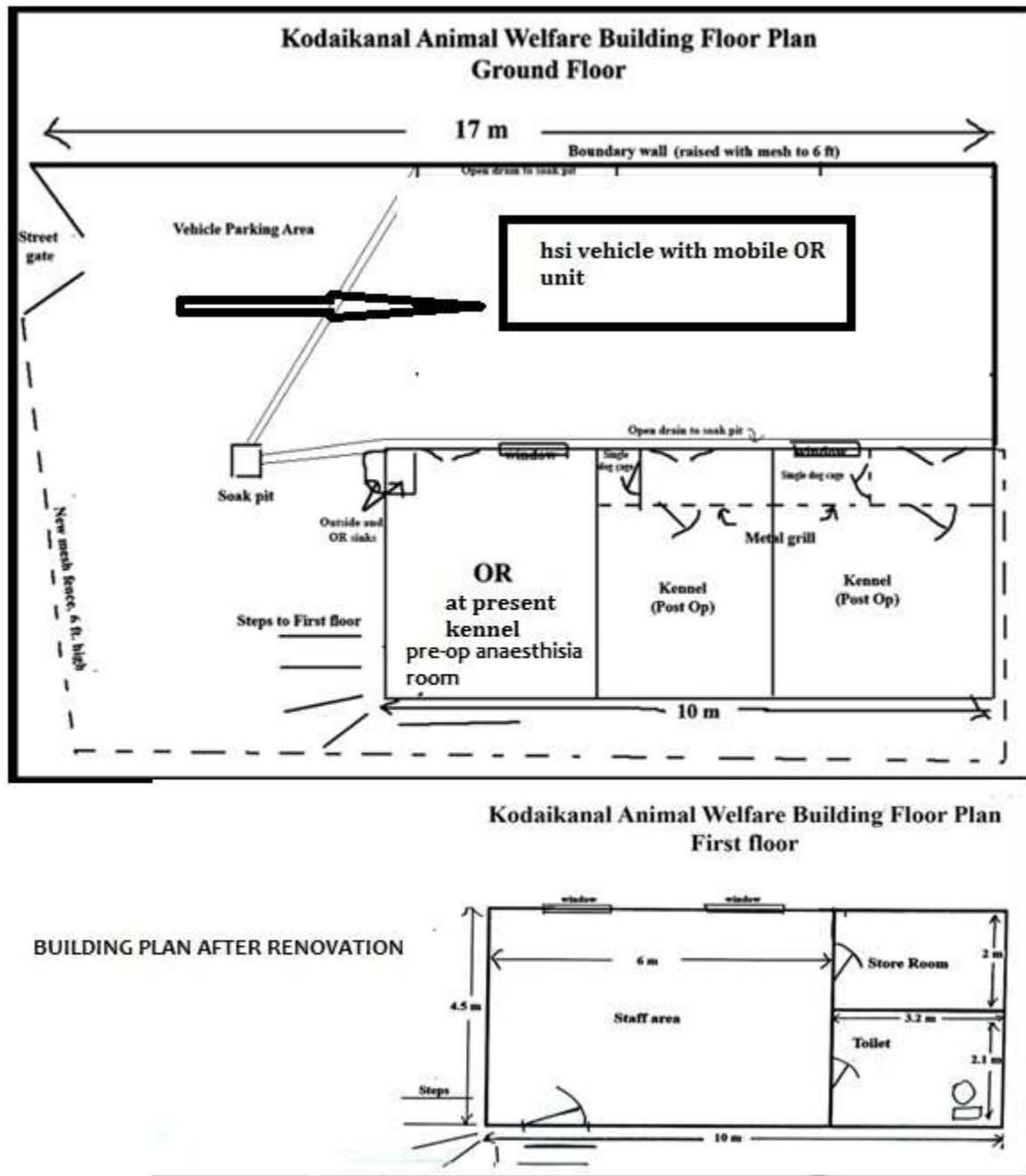

Why have your dog sterilized and rabies vaccinated?

Neutered dogs

- Mating and breeding stops
- No unwanted puppies
- Dogs will have a healthier life
- Dogs live more peacefully and longer

Anti-Rabies Vaccination

- Vaccinated dogs will not catch or spread RABIES
- Family and town will be safer from dog bites

If you do not want your dog sterilized please put a collar on it and tell dog catchers.

Dogs will be caught by trained dog catchers and put in a van. They will be brought to the Animal Welfare Facility (50 metres after Spencers on the right side of the ghat road) where Birth Control Surgery and Anti-rabies Vaccination will be done. They will be kept in the facility for two nights and then safely returned to the street corner or owner from where they were taken. Dogs will receive good food and excellent medical care while in the facility and will be given all necessary treatments, medicines, and rabies vaccinations for free. The dog's ear will be notched to indicate that ABC/ARV has been done.

This is a SAFE, FREE service that will be good for your dog and good for Kodaikanal.
